READ: 1 Samuel 25:1–39

1. Based on this passage, and Proverbs 1:7 – how does the bible define a fool?

As we discussed this Sunday, a fool has not much to do with someone who is "stupid", or even someone who makes bad choices. It's someone who actively rejects God based on their desire to please themselves.

2. Do you think foolishness is a choice or something that people "just are"? Explain.

Here is where it can become confusing. When we are wanting to please ourselves, and we are being selfish, we often make choices that are outright bad! I remember once being offered a personal loan in the mail that carried a 429% APR! Not a typo – I didn't leave out a decimal. Sure I could have bought myself something nice *right now*, so that I could worship my idol of "*fill in the blank*" but taking that loan would have been dumb, and worshiping my idol of whatever would have been foolish.

	3.	How did Nabal's foolishness put his entire household in danger?
	4.	How does the behavior of one spouse affect an entire family?
		Spiritual foolishness puts the whole family at risk. It gives the children the wrong view of God, it causes a rift in the marriage and usually the finances are a mess. When someone says "no, I can figure this out MY WAY" usually they cannot, and everything becomes a mess.
	5.	If someone you love is in a difficult marriage, how should you counsel them biblically? It's so easy to say "Girl/Bro, LEAVE". But that's not biblical. If I were speaking to a husband or a wife, I would ask them how they are doing at Ephesians 5. It's easy to say what they want to hear, but, it's so much more beneficial to <i>listen, then point them to Christ</i> .

TIPS ON GROUP PRAYER

Prayer is an essential part of being in a Point Group. Over the years, we've all been a part of an awkward prayer circle! To avoid that, have a look at these tips.

WE PRAY FOR ONE TOPIC AT A TIME - Anyone in the group is free to introduce a prayer request, either before prayer begins or during prayer time. Once a topic is introduced, the group focuses on that request alone. Once it's covered, the group moves on to the next topic.

PRAY MORE THAN ONCE - Because the group is focusing on one topic at a time, each person is encouraged to pray several times during the prayer time for those topics they feel most led to pray about. No one is required to pray.

WE KEEP OUR PRAYERS SHORT AND SIMPLE - Group prayer goes better when members keep their prayers short and to the point. When someone prays for a long time, it's hard for the other members to stay focused, and long prayers tend to intimidate those who are just learning to pray out loud in a group. No one is required to pray out loud.
